Livingston County Veterans Services

Livingston County Veteran Services (LCVS) offers a variety of programs and services to assist veterans and their families. LCVS employs nationally accredited Veteran Service Officers to assist veterans in filing for US Dept. of Veterans Affairs benefits. Honorably discharged veterans registered with LCVS, and their spouse may utilize complimentary LCVS transportation to medical appointments within a 50-mile radius. To schedule a ride, call LETS at (517) 546-6600, select option 3 and mention veteran status. LCVS offers honorably discharged indigent veterans several assistance programs provided by Emergency Relief funds, such as:

- Energy efficient upgrades or replacements of large appliances such as boilers, furnaces, central A/C, and refrigerators via LCVS partnership with Consumers Energy,
- \$200 food voucher plus an additional
 \$50 for each child in the household,
- \$200 clothing vouchers for their schoolaged children up to age 18, and
- Dental assistance of up to \$1,000 via LCVS partnership with VINA Dental.

Cohoctah Roads

Brine will be delivered to the Township controlled dirt roads at least two times this season: around Memorial Day and Fourth of July. This is funded through the Township's voter approved road millage.

Fall Large Item Clean Up

The fall large item clean-up is scheduled for October 12, 2024 from 8-12. The purpose is to allow <u>only</u> our residents to dispose of old appliances, furniture, and other items too large for regular trash service. (NOTE: fencing with the posts attached, propane tanks, fuel tanks, broken concrete, rocks, batteries, barrels, and cans of paint cannot be taken.) There will be a \$20 fee for freon appliances and a limit of 20 tires. We urge the residents to use these trash days to clean up the roads and ditches in the township. Volunteers needed! JOIN THE W8LRK amateur radio club in the annual ARRL Field Day event, June 22, Saturday noon to Sunday noon at the Cohoctah Township Park. Have you wanted to learn about Ham Radio? Have you wanted to try and talk to the world with nothing more than radio and wire antenna? Come to the park and try, FCC licensed radio operators will get you on the air.

The LARK club is located in Howell Mi at the Livingston County Airport and provides emergency communications and emergency response for the local communities. Mark Torigian, a Cohoctah Township Trustee is a member of the club and the CERT team. Enjoy the day at the park and try out Ham Radio. It is free! Board members, government officials and neighbors are invited to join.

Field Day is a day for fun and testing emergency communications equipment and personnel. The public is welcome to use a radio to experience firsthand how to operate emergency communications systems.

Township Recreation Plan

The Cohoctah Township Planning Commission is beginning the process of writing a township recreation plan. This plan will be developed with the help of the community with the intention of preserving land within the township.

A survey will be available to our residents via a link on our website. For those residents not able to complete the survey on-line, please visit the township hall during normal business hours and fill out a paper survey. Participation is imperative as this can decide whether we are eligible for grant money from the State and Federal Governments. When we are closer to producing a final plan, a public hearing will be held to inform the residents and receive your opinion on the draft. We welcome input from the community before the public hearing and encourage you to attend a monthly meeting to understand the intended result of our work.

Michigan Voting Rights Act

The voter approved Michigan Voting Rights Act mandates early voting access and availability for Michigan Residents. During State and Federal elections, Cohoctah Township will be joining forces with other municipalities to allow residents 9 days at the LESA building on Grand River Ave. in Howell. You may still vote on Election Day in Cohoctah township, vote absentee by mail, or request and vote an absentee ballot at the Cohoctah Township Hall turning it into local officials. The early voting option is different as it will allow you to place your ballot in the tabulator immediately after voting when voting at the LESA building during the 9 day period. Every other method of voting will be the same as before, meaning all votes will be tabulated on election day. Please visit our website for more information or call us at the township hall.
